Nahuatl (Navy blue) - Spoken in several states, including Puebla, Veracruz, and Hidalgo.

Mayan (Green) - Primarily spoken in the Yucatán Peninsula, including Campeche, and Quintana Roo.

Zapotec (Yellow) - In Oaxaca.

Mixtec (Pink) - Also spoken predominantly in Oaxaca.

Tzotzil (Orange) - In Chiapas.

Tarahumara/Rarámuri (Black) – Spoken in Chihuahua.

Yaqui (Brown) – In Sonora.

Otomi (Cyan) - In Hidalgo and State of Mexico

Purepecha (Light blue) - In Michoacán.

Huastec (Peach)- Found in Veracruz, San Luis Potosí, and Tamaulipas.

Triqui (Red) – In Oaxaca and Guerrero

Mixe (Gray) – Found in Oaxaca.

Mazatec (Beige) - In Oaxaca.

Totonac (Gold) - Veracruz and Puebla.

Mazateco (Purple) – Also found in Oaxaca.

Huichol (Maroon) - Found in parts of Jalisco and Nayarit.

Ch'ol (Olive) – Chiapas and Tabasco.

Tzeltal (Turquoise) - In Chiapas.
