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## **Present Continuous / Progressive - Form**

#### THE FORMS OF PRESENT CONTINUOUS / PROGRESSIVE

Affirmative: (am/is/are) + [VERB + ing]

#### Examples:

- I am watching TV now.
- You are practicing English at the moment.
- He is working at the office right now.
- She is playing volleyball.
- It's raining today.
- We are looking for a new apartment.
- You're studying mathematics.
- They're thinking about buying a house.

Negative: (am/is/are) + not + [VERB + ing]

#### Examples:

- I'm not reading the newspaper right now.
- He's not writing a letter.
- It's not snowing today.
- They are not doing their homework.

Interrogative: (am/is/are) + SUBJECT + [VERB + ing]

#### Examples:

- Are you going to the hospital? Yes, I am / No I'm not.
- Is he working today? Yes, he is / No, he isn't.
- **Isn't she coming** to the dinner? Yes, she is / No, she is not.
- **Is** the computer **working**? Yes, it is / No, it's not.
- Are they coming? Yes, they are / No, they are not.

You can add a **question word** (what, where, who, why, etc.) before the verb to be **(am, is, or are)** to ask for more information.

#### Examples:

- What are you doing? I'm eating chocolate.
- Where is Santiago going? He's going to the supermarket.
- Who are playing chess? Brian and Richard.
- Why is she crying? She fell down from her bicycle.

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### Spelling rules for [VERB + ing]

Here are the spelling rules:

Most verbs Add -ing	cook – cook <b>ing</b> eat – eat <b>ing</b> do – do <b>ing</b> speak - speak <b>ing</b> start - start <b>ing</b>
Verbs ending in: "-e" (except: -ee and -ie) Drop the -e and add -ing	dance - danc <b>ing</b> hope – hop <b>ing</b> make – mak <b>ing</b> ride – rid <b>ing</b> take - tak <b>ing</b> write - writ <b>ing</b>
Verbs endings in: "-ee" Add -ing	agree – agree <b>ing</b> see - see <b>ing</b>
Verbs endings in: "-ie" Change –ie to –y and add -ing	die – dy <b>ing</b> lie - lyi <b>ng</b>
One-syllable verbs endings in: consonant + vowel + consonant Double final consonant + -ing	jog – jogging run – running sit - sitting stop - stopping  Do not double one- syllable verbs endings in: -w, -x or -y: snow – snowing mix - mixing play – playing
Two or more syllables verbs endings in: consonant + vowel + consonant Double final consonant + -ing (only if the last syllable is stressed)	admit - admitting begin - beginning prefer - preferring  travel – travelling(UK) traveling (US) marvel – marvelling(UK) marveling (US)  Do not double if the last syllable is not stressed happen – happening offer - offering suffer - suffering visit – visiting
