Exercise 1: Greetings and countries

Match (→) the way of greeting with the country.

A way to show more respect to elders
and superiors is to use nin hao
(pronounced "neen haow") instead.

India

The common greetings include 'olá'
(hello), 'bom dia' (good day), 'boa
tarde' (good afternoon) and 'boa
noite' (good evening or good night).

Japan

The standard greeting is Namaste
(pronounced "nuh-muh-stay"). It is
accompanied with a prayer-like
gesture with palms together similar to
the wai in Thailand.

Brazil

The easiest way to say hello is with
the standard greeting of konnichiwa
(pronounced "kone-nee-chee-wah").
Shaking hands isn't always an option.
